'Direct Primary Care' Changing the Health Care Industry

The doctor and patient have the time to establish a relationship and develop a plan for the patient's long term health goals. The monthly membership of \$75 covers everything that can be done in the office.

Eliminating insurance involvement also reduces the overhead for the physician. No longer needing one or more administrative staff to process insurance claims, all employees can be medically skilled and assist in patient care instead of patient billing.

This new approach does limit the practice's profits but the physicians don't care. They, and the patients, are happier which leads to better quality of life for everyone.

Many Direct Primary Care facilities offer inhouse lab services through LabCorp. By procuring and packaging the samples, this allows the Direct Primary Care facility to offer reduced rates on tests that is often lower than even the co-pays required by insurances.

Small Businesses Embracing the New Model

Staffing has become a nationwide issue as the economy transforms. Businesses both big and small are struggling to find quality employees. The larger companies have a distinct advantage, being able to offer health insurance that smaller companies just can't afford.
